RECENT INNOVATION: *Gratitude.* No one word better captures my thoughts when reflecting on the

wonderful industry we're all blessed to be a part of. Last year presented everyone in pest control a series

This reality, combined with the fact that pest birds and their debris carry up to 109 communicable diseases, propelled Bird-B-Gone to record performance in 2020. I fully expect this trend to continue.

RECENT INNOVATION: Bird-X carefully evaluates products both in lab and field conditions before

introducing them to the market. Confidence that our products perform well in the field is very important. We are working to improve our current products continually. Often, tips from PMPs and installers help improve our current products, and develop new ones.

For example, physical barriers are the best practice recommendations to keep birds off of buildings. Yet, traditional products like netting may not be the best solution for every application.

Our latest physical barrier product, AviAngle, is a ledge-based bird exclusion product that is effective against all pest birds and wildlife. The combination of the smooth surface of the ultraviolet light (UV)protected polyvinyl chloride (PVC) material and the angle prevents birds and wildlife from being able to get a stable

foothold on the areas that have AviAngle installed. As a result, all birds and wildlife are permanently excluded from ledges. AviAngle

is ideal for



use on parking garages, billboards, bridges, I-beams, and ledge-based areas. Its modular combinations can be configured to fit any ledge depth size, and its exclusive design elements offer a wide range of bird control solutions. AviAngle can be painted or manufactured to the color of your choice.

PREDICTIONS: The COVID-19 pandemic has taught us all the importance of safe, sanitary work conditions. Bird control will become an even more important element in food plants, logistics, grocery stores, restaurants and more. We predict PMPs will become better aware of pest birds, related diseases and solutions to keep their teams and clients safe, and we look forward to supporting their efforts in 2021 and beyond.



INNOLYTICS

RECENT INNOVATIONS: It seems that the COVID-19 pandemic has not changed the behavior of pigeons

(Columbidae). While your customers may face new priorities, the damage from pigeons remains a pain

point for their facilities and structures.

OvoControl P (EPA Reg. No. 80224-1) represents "birth control" for pigeons and other pest birds. The contraceptive product is fed to pigeons at a rate of 1 pound per 80 pigeons daily, preventing fertilization and hatching of eggs – analogous to an insect growth regulator (IGR) for insects. OvoControl is classified as a



general-use pesticide and registered in all 50 states.

OvoControl P is ideally suited for large facilities where physical exclusion simply is not an option and dead and dying birds are not acceptable. Target sites include power plants, oil refineries, prisons, campuses, mining sites, steel mills and similar verticals.

A treated pigeon population will decline at a rate of about 50 percent annually through a natural process of attrition. With no new birds, the flock gradually, but predictably declines. They come to equilibrium at 5 percent to 10 percent of the starting point.

Innolytics is working on new formulations for other species, although the major pest birds already are included on the label. In addition to pigeons, starlings and grackles, we are developing formulations for house sparrows (*Passer domesticus*) and Muscovy ducks (*Cairina moschata*), which are a scourge along the Gulf Coast.

PREDICTIONS: We believe the future of bird control for PMPs will continue to be driven by innovative and humane solutions. The growth of bird control will outpace the overall growth in the pest control industry. Because of the exorbitant cost of development, actual pesticide registrations for avian species will be infrequent. Birds, especially migratory species, will continue to be a focus as disease carriers for livestock. Zoonotic disease and potential pandemics may increase in frequency, although each of these trends may represent additional opportunities.

PREDICTIONS: Overall, our team is optimistic that the bird control market will continue to grow over the next five years. Last year, even with the COVID-19 pandemic, Nixalite had a record year for sales. I believe that with technology booming, there will be only good things to come for the future of the bird control segment.
